As I prepared for this week's Harbinger cover I started my research on all the definitions I could find on GRACE. The scripture for this week is Ephesians 2:4-10,

"But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions — it is by grace you have been saved..."

In reviewing and reading the numerous definitions and various Bible translations the one for me that personally stood out the most (ironically from Wikipedia) was as follows: "Divine Grace has been defined as the divine influence which operates in humans to regenerate and sanctify, to inspire virtuous impulses, and to impart strength to endure trial and resist temptation; and as an individual virtue or excellence of divine origin."

Having been raised an Irish Italian son of a strict Catholic influence and being an extraverted artist with ADD you can only imagine there might be some emotional and extreme highs and lows in my past and most assuredly, future (Thank God Becca is along for the ride). So, when I reflect on my experiences, both good and bad, at times when I felt maybe less in control of my emotions, behaviors, and responses in these situations, I think of people in my life that have modeled real grace in similar times.

When I am challenged as a father by my boys and teen daughter, only then do I appreciate the fleeting moments of grace my father mustered for me, the quiet moments my grandfather wrangled into a story that captured a rambunctious boy, and the calming nature of my mother's touch and voice.

I appreciate it in the workplace with peers and clients when diplomacy and restraint are tested. And even in over exuberant excitement, when I start to talk my daughter's ears off or get on my soap box or wave my hands around (Becca's favorite). Even in great joy there is a grace in observation and quiet appreciation I am still working hard to practice. Becca and I use the term "steady eddy" to describe this more reflective, leveled sense and balance of emotion, and at certain times in my life this becomes my aim. As the definition says, "it is by grace you have been saved..." I believe these moments in my own life require a constant striving for both forgiveness and appreciation. Only when I catch myself long enough to truly appreciate my blessings do I feel moments of grace.

I also believe that grace is the power to (as the wiki definition describes) "inspire virtuous impulses," those moments when a higher hand nudges us in directions not commonly taken. It inspires us to reach out to those less fortunate, volunteer for things not easy, and put ourselves in uncomfortable situations. I pray that my children are fortunate enough to have many virtuous impulses in their future and that grace, in both forgiveness and strength, comes early and often in their lives.

ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

We at Westminster believe that education is essential for discipleship, and hope that what you learn in this place will transform your living beyond our doors. Each quarter we offer four classes, covering topics that range from theology and Biblical literacy to culture. This quarter began on **Sunday, September 9**, and will run each Sunday **through October 28**. You are welcome to join any class at any point!

1. **Confirmation for Adults**

This class will study the same curriculum our 9th grade confirmation students study each spring. It would be a great experience for parents whose children will go through confirmation anytime in the next few years, but we welcome adults of any stage to refresh their faith by remembering what it means to belong to God and to be Presbyterian!

2. **Wisdom Calls**

This class will study the Wisdom Literature of the Old Testament (the books of Proverbs, Job, and Ecclesiastes and the Apocryphal books of Sirach and Wisdom of Solomon). In addition to exploring the texts of the books, we will try to apply their lessons to contemporary life using a recent book by Paul Lewis, *Wisdom Calls: The Moral Story of the Hebrew Bible* (available in the WPC library).

3. **What the Bible Doesn't Say**

Where are all the windows God is opening after closing the door? Or the sins we hate that don't reflect back on the sinner? Did God "say it" so we have to believe it, and does God prefer to help only those who are getting after their own good? This lecture-based class will examine the cultural sayings that have settled into our religious vocabulary. We'll ask what we can learn from popular religion and where we might diverge in our own faithfulness.

4. **Visionaries, Idealists, and Creative Geniuses**
