From the Loft, Marlon Hurst

Today's *Music Sunday* service takes us on a journey toward a "new Jerusalem". The vision of this city is described in the Book of Revelation in images of grandeur and idealism (echoing language from the prophet Isaiah). It is a place where the inhabitants' lives are illumined by the light of God, the grieving are comforted, the thirsty drink from crystal clear fountains, and all nations and rulers adhere to God's justice of peace and equity. In certain traditions, utopian visions found in scripture are viewed as predictions of a future state of being. However, these words, written during a time of exile and religious persecution, offered a vision of God's reality, contrary to the political and economic conditions of the time. If we rush to our destination by dismissing the message solely as a utopian future vision, we may miss opportunities to discover gifts of community and resurrection along the way.

At the onset of this morning's journey, the Chorister choirs invite us to "make a joyful noise" to God, who gives us life – proclaiming that it was God who created the earth and all that live in it, and that we are charged to "care for all creation" so that "all may live abundantly." In other words, the vision of Revelation has been present with us from the outset. But, of course, we have not always cared for creation, and all do not live abundantly. So, we "Gather at the River," the symbol of God's baptismal mercy and grace, and begin taking steps toward God's everlasting Kingdom, drawn ever forward as we listen for the distant "melody of peace." Following the "Gloria Patri," the Chancel Choir sings of God's grace that flows from heaven to earth and from earth to heaven – joining God's heavenly vision with God's earthly creation.

In *Come and Go to that Land*, the Youth Choir reminds us that our journey is not a solo trek. We travel together towards that "beautiful city," our "Savior's house." Todd Monsell's evocative piece *Then I Saw a New Heaven*, composed for today's service, provides for us a tonal picture of the "new heaven" as a place where multiple harmonies (symbolizing multiple realities and perspectives) coexist in new and unexpected ways. *We Shall Overcome* reminds us that we are joined by saints who came before us and who charted our course towards justice and righteousness, even when that destination was hidden from view. Because of their witness, we are strengthened with the faith that "God will see us through."

Our journey this morning concludes with all choirs and congregation singing *A New Jerusalem Arise*, bringing together God's vision found in Genesis, Isaiah, and Revelation. As we reach the journey's end, we can look back and see that God's mercy and grace have been with us all along and that the vision of a "new Jerusalem" is less of a destination than it is a roadmap for traveling.

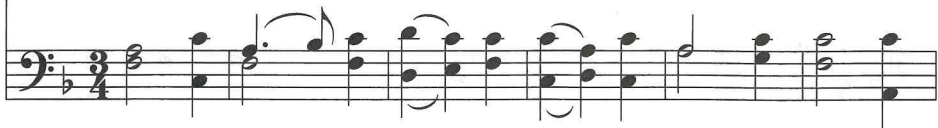
