In reading Psalm 8, two things stand out to me. First, God has given humanity a special place in his creations on earth. Granted earth is not without its dangers such as hurricanes and earthquakes. But it was created especially for us. Second, God has given us dominion over the earth to use its resources for ourselves.


Carrie and I have always enjoyed outdoor activities including hiking, skiing and sailing. This has given us plenty of opportunities to experience the beauty of nature. Sunset or sunrise at the beach can be wonderful. Seeing the Milky Way without light pollution is a grand wonder. New growth in the spring and the trees changing colors in the fall cannot be missed. God has given us such a wonderful place to live. Looking at the stars makes us realize that even as insignificant creatures, God has loved us in ways we do not fully appreciate. When we are outside, Carrie and I are always praising God for this world and his generosity in placing us in such a special place.

God has given us insignificant humans dominion over the world including the animals and fishes. When Psalm 8 was written, humans had already domesticated most of the farm animals and crops we see today. At that time, population was small. So, the human imprint on the world in the form of land and resource use was correspondingly low.



But is "dominion" the right translation or should it be "stewardship"? There are potential differences in interpretation of the Psalm depending on which word is used.

No, I am not going to become a vegan to save animals. I know that chicken is a bird and not something purchased at Publix in plastic wrap. I do consider stewardship to be what God intended, and I try to be a good steward of this wonderful world God gave to us to live in and use.




