One of the hardest parts of Christianity for me to understand is the act of sin. The obvious definition of sin is to go against God's word and his commandments, as found in today's scripture, Exodus 20:1-17. A more complex definition of sin is anything that breaks, alters, or hurts your relationship with God. God created us in the beginning to live and be in a loving, dependent relationship with him. As we commit sins, we break that relationship and we look to other variables to heal our brokenness. We look to others to solve our problems, to the world, or to ourselves to feel better about what we did wrong.

It's difficult to always turn to God with every single issue because I usually want to go about finding my own solution. Every time something goes wrong in my life I don't think, "Okay, let me turn to God." Instead, I think "Okay, if I was only better at this, more self-disciplined and smarter, I could do this." But that's the problem. That's one of my sins. There is no "better," future version of myself who can make everything perfect. Turning only to myself to solve my problems is a temporary quench of thirst and if I keep going, the well is going to run dry. I find myself breaking a commandment, "You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath." (Exodus 20:4) God wants a loving, dependent relationship with me, and by looking for this idol version of myself, I'm breaking my relationship with him.

God never needed people, but we needed him. He created a perfect world, and we chose to veer away from perfection to satisfy ourselves. We are always going to sin, and God is always going to be there watching us break. We just have to remember to look to him to heal our brokenness because we can't fix it all ourselves.
