THE SUNDAY OF PENTECOST

As humans, we are naturally born to ask the question, “Why?” Parents dread the day that toddlers learn the word, teachers dread it from teenagers, and then we drown in the question even more once we reach “adulthood.” We ask why when something bad happens, when something good happens, or when nothing happens. You can try and convince someone that humans are just naturally inquisitive people, but the truth is, there is a need for control, and answering that *why* allows us to feel power in our own lives. The answer that we are taught growing up is that God is in control but the truth is, sometimes that answer isn’t enough.

In the scripture lesson for this week, God fulfills his promise to pour out his Spirit on all of his people. God sends the Holy Spirit down, and everyone is overcome with their faith in God. They don’t ask why this is happening. No one asked why there was fire or wind. No one questioned why they were speaking in different languages. Their faith in God was so strong that they trusted God and they knew the Holy Spirit was inside of them.

Peter uses God’s word to speak and says, “*And it shall be that everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved* (Acts 2: 21).” If what Peter says is true, then why do we still need so much reassurance that we are on the right path? God is constantly at work for us, but God still chooses to challenge us. I think by sending us through certain obstacles, God gives us a choice in our faith. You can question and analyze the situation, or you can call on the Holy Spirit and trust in God. We don’t need the fire, wind, or one defining moment that confirms our faith in God. God’s Spirit is with us, no matter how many times we find ourselves asking, “Why?”
