Sometimes, being a modern day Christian can feel like the exiled psalmist in Psalm 42 seems to feel, downright depressing! The psalmist is in deep despair, likely for many reasons, and has a deep need for God. His need is so desperate that he "thirsts" for Him. He mourns the prolonged distance from his temple, the unbelievers taunting him, the happier days in his life, his life's overwhelming trials and tribulations, and God's seemingly slow response to his calls. I think we can also identify with many of these worries. Sometimes, the greatest struggle can be feeling the weight of negativity and evil around us and wondering if we can truly make any difference for God or if there is any hope to be found.

The psalmist here can be admired because, despite all that he has been through, he is able to turn inward, cast out negative thinking, and put his hope in God. He decides to challenge his gloom and look for God's face, which he knows is worthy of hope and praise, even though he isn't really feeling up to it. In The Message translation the psalmist speaks to himself and it reads, "Why are you down in the dumps, dear soul? Why are you crying the blues? Fix my eyes on God, soon I'll be praising again. He puts a smile on my face. He's my God."
