"In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps.' Proverbs 16:9

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11

"It's the transitions that are the hard parts," she said, "once you actually get there, it's usually fine. It's the getting there that's tough." She should know. She has had transitions in her life - growing up, getting married, moving from place to place, raising children, living a full, engaged life, caring for elderly parents. Ups and downs. When she said that, she was talking specifically about raising children. Actually, she was talking about her child raising a child – her grandchild – which I guess made it different and enabled her to offer that perspective. She could have been talking about anything

We are in a sea of constant change as we move through our lives. The transitions are just those times when we happen to notice the change. As she said, in the being there, we are usually fine. Happy and content even.

I like to think of happiness – at least partly – as a choice. There are certainly circumstances that make happiness difficult, if not impossible, to achieve, but overall one's attitude and choice is a tremendous factor in one's happiness. Every day, regardless of the circumstances, you get some say in it.

One of the peculiarities of human consciousness is our awareness of the future. We are mindful that there is time – abstract and unknowable – that we have not yet lived. This future is hard-wired into us and our actions. We plan for it. We anticipate it. We worry about it. We brush our teeth, exercise, save money, check the 7-day weather forecast and buy green bananas. We know it looms out there. For us to have happiness in our lives, we have to believe that the future holds good things for us, those we love and the things we care about. I believe that is something we don't put enough energy into expressing. That at our core, most people believe the future will be good, that things will be better. In the future, when we picture it, the sun's always shining. It's a better day. The change, the transitions that get us there – the cloudy days – those are the hard parts. Through salvation, God promises us that future. A better day. I would like to challenge you to choose happiness, choose to believe that the future holds better days, that God's love and salvation is the plan set out for you. And that like God's love, the sun is always shining, even behind the clouds.
