I received an orchid last summer during a prolonged illness. Having strong horticultural genes, but not an overly green thumb, I decided to follow the directions on the attached tag very precisely. I placed my orchid in a well-lit area and watered it with three well-chosen ice cubes a week. This seemed to work beautifully for a number of months. The flowers did fall off once, only to return again a few weeks later. However, after that I noticed a gradual browning of the single stalk starting from the top and working its way eventually all the way to the base. Saddened, I began to wonder if this was a sign that it was going to wither and die, or that I was too horrible a person to keep a plant alive, or most likely that I just didn't get the right gardening genes. Surprisingly the leaves at the base remained green so I continued on with the ice cubes each week. Week after week I have faithfully placed three cubes. About a month ago, I noticed a bright green stalk popping its way up from between the leaves and it is now about 5 inches long!

Today's scripture lesson, Isaiah 11:1-10, is a very familiar one to us. Though Isaiah, the prophet and poet, lived during a very grim time, he tries to paint a picture of what God yearns for the world. He is creating an image of new life springing up in a totally unexpected place. Life from death like the shoot from the stump. Jesse, to whom he refers, was the father of King David who was hailed in Isaiah's time as the last great king. Isaiah is envisioning a new "branch" who will be greater than all who have come before. From this new branch will be a king with whom the spirit will rest. This king will be wise, powerful, and understanding. He will bring justice for the poor, be obedient to God, and will be clothed in righteousness and faithfulness.

In this world God yearns for, there is knowledge by all people of a living God and a desire for peace where "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them." Oh, what a wonderful world this would be!

I don't know that I have the stump of Jesse on my desk, but I hope my orchid continues to grow and flourish. It is a sign that beauty can sprout from things that seem dead or dying especially if they are cared for. It reminds me of how well I was cared for when I was sick, by my family and by many members of this church family. It will remind me of God's dream for this world and help me find my purpose and live into it. I hope it will keep me encouraged even when the world can seem discouraging. I know that God's purposes are reached through us, his children. We can work toward creating the world he longs for through our gifts and talents, through our generous giving of time and resources, through the kindness and respect we show to others, and through actively centering our lives on our Christian faith.
