# A Service of Installation for Ben Dorr will be held on Sunday, February 10, 2019 at 3pm.

What is an installation service? It is a time in the life of our congregation when we gather to recognize and affirm the call that God has placed on a particular person or persons for service to the church. When a pastor is called to serve a congregation in our denomination, the service of installation can take place as part of the church's regular morning worship, or as a separate worship service.

Foundational to our theology is the belief that all in the church have been given gifts by God to serve and follow Christ. As Paul states in 1 Corinthians 12, "there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord...". The Book of Order of the PC(USA) describes it this way:

"In Baptism each Christian is called to ministry in Christ's name. God calls some persons from the midst of congregations to fulfill particular functions, so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish... In installation the church sets in place with prayer those who have been (previously) ordained as...ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and are now called anew to service in that ministry."

Installation is not a coronation. It is not a way of saying that ministers are ordained to a higher office. Indeed, when new elders begin their service on the Session at Westminster, those elders are ordained and installed as a way of recognizing and rejoicing in their call to serve Christ's church. When a minister is installed, she or he answers the same constitutional questions that our elders answer at their service of ordination/installation.

You may notice a few distinct features in the installation service on February 10th. One is that a guest minister, the Rev. Mark Ramsey, will preach. Mark and I have known each other for over 30 years. We met when I served as a youth representative on the Pastor Nominating Committee that called Mark to my home church in Okemos, Michigan, in 1987. Mark then served as a mentor to me when I worked as a seminary intern at his church in Denver, Colorado in 1995.

The Rev. Steve Doughty will offer a charge to me. Steve served as the Executive Presbyter of Lake Michigan Presbytery when I was ordained in 1998. I have asked the Rev. Gordon Raynal to offer the charge to Westminster. Gordon currently serves as the Stated Clerk of our Presbytery and has known Westminster for years.

What is an installation service? It is a time in the life of our congregation when we gather to recognize and affirm the call that God has placed on a particular person or persons for service to the church. When a pastor is called to serve a congregation in our denomination, the service of installation can take place as part of the church's regular morning worship, or as a separate worship service.

Foundational to our theology is the belief that all in the church have been given gifts by God to serve and follow Christ. As Paul states in 1 Corinthians 12, "there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord...". The Book of Order of the PC(USA) describes it this way:

"In Baptism each Christian is called to ministry in Christ's name. God calls some persons from the midst of congregations to fulfill particular functions, so that the ministry of the whole people of God may flourish...In installation the church sets in place with prayer those who have been (previously) ordained as...ministers of the Word and Sacrament, and are now called anew to service in that ministry."

Installation is not a coronation. It is not a way of saying that ministers are ordained to a higher office. Indeed, when new elders begin their service on the Session at Westminster, those elders are ordained and installed as a way of recognizing and rejoicing in their call to serve Christ's church. When a minister is installed, she or he answers the same constitutional questions that our elders answer at their service of ordination/installation.

You may notice a few distinct features in the installation service on February 10th. One is that a guest minister, the Rev. Mark Ramsey, will preach. Mark and I have known each other for over 30 years. We met when I served as a youth representative on the Pastor Nominating Committee that called Mark to my home church in Okemos, Michigan, in 1987. Mark then served as a mentor to me when I worked as a seminary intern at his church in Denver. Colorado in 1995.

The Rev. Steve Doughty will offer a charge to me. Steve served as the Executive Presbyter of Lake Michigan Presbytery when I was ordained in 1998. I have asked the Rev. Gordon Raynal to offer the charge to Westminster. Gordon currently serves as the Stated Clerk of our Presbytery and has known Westminster for years.
