interesting facts about Lent:

preparation.

Recently, a number of churches in the PC(USA) have sought to use the Lenten season to engage the congregation and encourage spiritual growth in ways other than the historic Lenten traditions. While there are any number of creative programs out there, the main idea is to promote focused and intentional spiritual growth during Lent as a way or preparing for the resurrection, as opposed to fasting or abstinence. This is appealing to me, and perhaps to some of you, as it pushes me to learn and seek to understand more about our faith. I say this not as a condemnation of the historical approach. As many people observe Lent in the traditional way, it clearly resonates with many and any practices that strengthens one's faith are wonderful. However, for me, having an alternative way to observe Lent is welcome.

As I was looking at these types of programs, I realized the riches we, as a congregation, have at WPC. Think about the book clubs, reading groups, interest groups (hiking, knitting, etc.), and mission opportunities our church provides. It is an amazing array of opportunities to engage and to grow that are available year-round. It is simply a matter of saying "I will participate." Perhaps we all should consider trying something new and taking advantage of one of the many opportunities in front of us during Lent. Here is to a Lenten season of spiritual growth!

The observance of Lent was not part of my church upbringing, so Lent has always been a bit of a mystery to me. Growing up as a Methodist in Southwest Georgia, Lent was simply something my Catholic friends observed. And to be quite honest, it did not seem like much fun. They were giving up things I really liked, such as chocolate, and had to eat fish on Friday. As I am not a big fan of giving up things I like or of fish, you can understand why Lent was not of much interest to me. Over time, I have become more interested in Lent. A quick Google search reveals several

1. Lent is not mentioned in the Bible, though many of the practices that are characteristic of Lent, such as fasting, are seen throughout the Bible.

2. Lent is said to be 40 days, but that does not include Sundays, so the number of elapsed days is 46.

3. 'Lent' is a shortened version of the Old English word 'lencten,' which means the season of spring.

4. The Catholics are credited with starting the tradition of Lent around the year 325, from which it spread to many other Christian denominations over time.

When you step away from the specific acts and focus on the purpose, the season of Lent is a time of preparation for the resurrection of Christ. While this preparation has often been characterized by fasting, abstinence from vices, financial gifts, and repentance, it does not have to be observed in those ways. This was surprising to me, as that is what I have always associated with Lent. But when you look at the handful of facts above and consider the intention behind Lent, you can begin to understand that such traditional approaches are but a small handful of the potential methods of

Some of the different programs churches have used include introduction of additional spiritual practices such as meditation where the participants take a daily Bible verse and meditate on it, groups focused on caring for our environment and living simply, creating opportunities for connecting to others in the congregation, and discussion or book groups based on the themes of the resurrection. These illustrate that it can be both individually focused as well as group activities.

ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES

We at Westminster believe that education is essential for discipleship, and hope that what you learn in this place will transform your living beyond our doors. Each quarter we offer three classes, covering topics that range from theology and Biblical literacy to culture. This quarter kicks off on Sunday, March 3, and will run each Sunday through April 14. You are welcome to join any class at any point!

1. Sinning Like a Christian: Exploring the Seven Deadly Sins

This lecture-based course will explore the classical theme of the "Seven Deadly Sins" as a way to understand the human condition and good news of God's forgiveness. We will explore the history and consequence of the "capital vices" and the ways we can cultivate Christian discipleship and virtue in our lives.

Teacher: Leigh Stuckey, Associate Pastor at Westminster 209 Room:

2. The Gospel Stories: Why Four Points of View?

Based on Steven L. Bridges's book Getting the Gospels: Understanding the New Testament Accounts of Jesus' Life, we will learn together what these four stories can teach us about Jesus' life and our mission. The Gospel Stories is a discussion-based class.

Teacher: Judith Chandler

Judith is a member of Westminster and has taught at Furman's Lifelong Learning Institute since its inception. She is also a recognized local artist.

The Call: The Life & Message of the Apostle Paul 3.

Follow the journeys of Paul with author and pastor Adam Hamilton and leaders of WPC's Flock, a fellowship group for members in their late 30s and 40s. The study begins with Paul's dramatic conversion, as he spread the Gospel through modern-day Greece and Turkey. Travel to the early church sites and explore Paul's conversations with the Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Thessalonians. In this seven-week study, you are invited to experience faith through Christ's greatest teacher and missionary. This class is geared toward Flock-aged folks and is discussion-based.
