Evangelism has always been my weakest spiritual gift, or so I thought. I know that our society is desperate for hope, and even when everything is going well, I am inexplicably drawn to God's ability to help – pulled to the promise of peace. There have been times in my life when I did not believe help would come; and yet, in these darkest moments of my fear, there has always been a supernatural peace. I know that my relationship with God is part of the "good news" all Christians are called to proclaim in the world, but it almost seems like a faux pas to even talk about.

One childhood experience that I go back to quite a bit in my mind is the moment that I can say for certain I knew God was real. My parents were managing life as best they could and as an astute child, I was particularly aware of the stress they were under. This, on top of the fact that my dad tended to yell when he was afraid, made for one particularly petrifying night. Huddled in my bed, fearing the worst, I recall frantically praying the Lord's Prayer over and over. Suddenly, I felt an unnatural sense of calm wash over my body and a warm light filled my room – a detail my older brother never recalls seeing.

Maybe I watched too many televangelism programs with my grandmother or maybe it was a psychological phenomenon, brought on by the fear and stress of an over-imaginative mind... it certainly was not a very "Presbyterian" experience... but I know the extraordinary moment was from the father.

Regardless of our comfort level with angelic occurrences like mine, miracles are not always the type of peace that we are promised, nor are they always the opening line of our testimony. Peace and salvation are inseverable concepts, bound together in the Holy Spirit with an undeniable supernatural component. Proclaiming the Gospel is more than just something we should do, and it most certainly is not something we can avoid by giving someone else the money for the heavy lifting. How ever you feel about it, and no matter what you call it, proclaiming the good news is a divine compulsion – a love that will not let us go. The very fiber of creation desires to cry out the glory of the Lord.

It doesn't take an unusual cosmic event to share a kind and gentle word with someone or demonstrate a simple act of selfless love. Often the warm light that fills the room is found in the eyes of a friend or even a stranger. Our neighbors are desperate for hope and ready to listen; and through the Holy Spirit, we have the power and the words to bring them eternal peace.
