If you've ever been asked to write the Harbinger cover, then you know that you are given the scripture passages that will be shared the Sunday your cover is published. Though not specifically instructed to use them, the idea is that they will inform and inspire your Harbinger content. I have found that to be very helpful and for my previous two covers, I have enjoyed meditating on one of the verses and letting them inspire my writing.

This time, though, it has not been enjoyable at all. In fact, I've put this off until the very last minute, doing anything to avoid reading and thinking on the New Testament verses.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven. Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you."

Please tell me that I am not alone in cringing when I read these red letter, quotation marked, straight-from-Jesus'-mouth words. Do I judge? Yes. Condemn? Yes. Forgive? Not always. Give? Not enough. I can all too quickly and easily think of plenty of examples of my judging, condemning, unforgiving, stingy ways. I don't want the measure I use to be used to measure me. I want a much more generous and forgiving measure to be used. And frankly, I'm going to be listening hard in the sermon today to hear the loophole for this whole measure thing.

But I bet there is no loophole. Throughout the entire 6th chapter of Luke, it is pretty clear that Jesus wants our hearts and minds to offer grace to others. Our words, our thoughts, and our actions matter. How we treat others - especially those who are difficult to love or even like - is important. So I pray that God will help me — and us — to use the measure that brings abundant grace to everyone in our lives.
