For most of my adult life I've always taken on the problems and complexities, both subtle and not so, with a "lowest common denominator" or "common-sense" approach. I was raised in part by a brilliant man with a kind heart who had a penchant for the understated. I recall a conversation during my teen years when I asked my father when he planned to replace his very old, very large, Lincoln Town Car which he sensed (correctly so) was a point of embarrassment for his teenage son. His response was simple: "Boy, my personality doesn't ride on four wheels." That was it. I was thirty-seven years old when he passed away and he was just three years into the third car I had ever known him to own.

Now you might be wondering what cars, teenagers, or common sense have to do with scripture from Romans in the Bible. To be honest, I wonder if I am breaking a law or committing a sin by using "cars," "teenagers," and "common sense" in the same sentence...twice mind you. I predict that on Sunday Ben Dorr will deliver an incredibly articulate, enlightening, and even humorous sermon from a theological perspective. I am grateful for his insight and gift of clarity. Furthermore, I am humbled when my thoughts about scripture are printed right there on the cover of the *Harbinger* for all to read...then compared with the oratory of Ben on the same day.

Romans 3:21-26 "But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus."

If I were a modern day disciple I would choose this passage as my closing argument to answer the question "Why Christianity?" With my predilection for using common sense in decision making, I would answer the question with yet another. That would be a simply stated "Why not?" Honestly, what do we have to lose? The human condition, such that it is, is predicated on a life of imperfection and errancy. Simply stated...we all sin. The length of time that we inhabit this earth is minuscule though not insignificant. Eternity compared to our time here...the difference is beyond compare. How do we extend our existence beyond our earthly confines? Faith is the answer. It's that simple. Faith. What do you have to lose?
