Faith is such a curious thing. We all like the feel-good reassurance of the phrase "let go and let God." And yeah, the word looks nice in arabesque letters on a powder room wall; but what does it really mean?

The faithfulness described in the Old Testament does not seem like something you would use as decorative wall art. In addition to the strict obedience, risky sacrifice and generations of uncertain anticipation, it often required bloodshed. Living by faith can be difficult and we don't always get it right.

I find that I tend to lose faith because I am afraid, selfish, distracted, tired, or prideful. Usually it is just a passing thought; however, there are big moments when I really struggle with the call to live in faith. This questioning often happens when I am on my drive home, listening to NPR, and hear of another mass shooting, global crisis, or squabble between our elected officials. Ultimately, these moments bring me closer to God – but not by my own doing – and the outcome is never what I expect. Our Messiah came from a lineage of faithful kings, and yet, even in their disobedience, and ours, God provided salvation.

The struggle of early biblical faith came in part from expectation, the promise of what was still to come: faith in a foretold ruler coming to end slavery and champion the everyman. Our struggle is supposed to be different. The Messiah was born and is still alive. And yet, here I am, waiting for what I think is supposed to happen. But what if faith is about something better, what if it brings freedom every day? Freedom to love, help, and make change in the world now. When I struggle with my belief I lean in, rest in the moment, listen and then respond. For me faith becomes a mantra, a constant meditation through Christ, and something to spur me on to action. God grants the strength and also the grace for the times when we fall short; all we have to do is rest in his promise and embrace our role in it.
