# ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY

Today we celebrate All Saints' Sunday. In our Christian liturgical year, All Saints' Day is always November 1, but because November 1 does not often fall on a Sunday, it is common practice in the Reformed tradition to observe All Saints' Sunday on the first Sunday of November.

Presbyterians do not understand saints as people who are holier than others, nor as people who have lived a greater moral life than others. In our tradition, each of us is a saint. To call someone a saint in the Presbyterian Church is to say that they have been claimed by God, called by God, and can never be separated from God's grace. Through each of us, God shines God's light and shares God's love, and that makes every one of us a saint.

Whenever we receive communion, our tradition teaches us that we celebrate this sacrament not only with all those gathered for worship on that particular Sunday, but with all the saints who have gone before us, and who are now members of the Church Triumphant. This is part of what is meant by "the communion of the saints" in the Apostles' Creed. Our tradition teaches us that we are bound to one another through Christ's love not only in this life, but even after death. Death changes our relationships with our loved ones, but it does not end those relationships.

We celebrate this reality every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper as a congregation. While some of our loved ones are no longer with us as they once were, they are still with us in the mysterious communion of the eternal Church that is formed by God's redemptive love. On All Saints' Sunday, we rejoice in this community of saints from every time and place.

You are invited today to remember the saints in your own life, those children of God who have shared God's grace with you and through whom you have known the love of Jesus Christ.

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
