In her 20s, Maya Angelou was asked by her instructor to reread a line from H. Emilie Cady's classic <u>Lessons in Truth</u> to her class. She emphatically read "God loves me," and in that instant, she said that she knew she was a child of God. She left the room and started weeping. She would later recall that those words were humbling and that they gave her newfound freedom to go out and do good things and do them well.

"That's why I am who I am, because God loves me, and I'm amazed at it," she said in an interview with Oprah Winfrey. Angelou said she gained a new appreciation for praying. Her prayers focused on offering thanks, "Thanking God for God, thanking God for Jesus, and thanking Jesus for Jesus."

As I read this story about such a knowledgeable and powerful woman whom I've had as a professor in college and whom I've admired, I couldn't help but connect it to this week's Bible verse. In Corinth, the church that Paul created was being divided by groups who followed different human leaders of the church. Paul's letter to the Christians was to stop dividing themselves and become unified in and around Christ. Paul begins the letter with thanks for the great and powerful gifts God has given to them by His grace and through their faith in Christ. He reminds them that their faith in Christ (not human leaders) is what makes them a Christian and is also what unites them.

At the end of this week's verse, Paul explains that Christ's death on the cross may seem weak and foolish to the world, but he reminds us that God has given faith in Christ to those who believe it and find God's power and wisdom.

As amazing as Maya Angelou was, she too was human like the rest of us, working to live a life of gratitude through Christ. Through her focused faith, God used her to share his word. Her story was a reminder to me that God loves each one of us and to consistently express gratitude through prayer to God who loves me.
