Firstly, Jesus did not approach the mountain alone. He invited those closest to him to join in the journey with him. I believe that he recognized that the work of God cannot best be accomplished in isolation and that it requires a community to allow its fullest expression. Following in the footsteps of Moses who approached the mountain of God with Joshua, Jesus felt compelled to bring witnesses and supporters to join him on his path. I believe that he was demonstrating that our faith is best fostered within relationship to one another in worship.

This passage also is clear about the sense of power and might that the disciples felt as they witnessed the spectacle being shown to them. The fire and light that radiated through Christ is unambiguous and the bright cloud that descended on the group was overwhelming to them all. This feeling of awe and reverence that Peter, James, and John demonstrated is an experience that I try to foster in my life and I think is key to bringing meaning to why I worship.

the living of our life.

Lastly, Christ offered his terrified followers a release from the fear that the awesome power of God had caused in them. He came and touched them, saving "Don't be afraid." In this personal and intimate gesture Christ demonstrates how we are to accept our life in worship and support one another. Despite his glorification he immediately chose to stoop and raise up the people for whom he cared. I pray that we all may be freed from fear to lift up those who are in need, with Christ's help.

TRANSFIGURATION

In our passage for today the Lord travels with three of his closest disciples to a secluded place on the mountain, high up and away from the group. He has just told His followers that "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" and he knows what God has in his plan for our salvation. We hear dramatic and meaningful elements, such as the appearance of Moses and Elijah, figures that some see as representing the law and the prophets, as well as the terrifying and unexpected voice from the cloud speaking for all to hear claiming Jesus as his own. This passage describing the Transfiguration of Christ bears witness to the true divinity of Jesus and to the power that he has been given, but I think that it may have something to say more directly to each of us.

I hear in these words a map or template for how we all should view our own worship experience. In Jesus's words and actions, as he acknowledges and demonstrates his relationship with God, we all may see a model of how we can better approach Christ in prayer and build each other towards the Kingdom of Heaven.

There is also an undeniable theme of change in this passage. Christ, though he begged to keep it secret, was physically changed in his appearance and in his relationships while on the mountain. In the same way, we are truly changed in our baptism and in our profession of faith and belief in the risen Christ. He felt that his change must remain secret for a while, while ours may and should be proclaimed always in worship and in
