From the Pews, Jade Fountain:

About 5 months ago, I gave birth to my second child. As a pregnant woman, you spend a fair amount of time hoping for something unseen. Certainly, there is evidence of what is unseen - what with the growing stomach and swelling feet - but you spend an awful lot of time waiting for something, someone that you haven't laid eyes on. You wait and you wait and you wait... with a certain amount of patience (or impatience). But while you are waiting, you don't sit idly - you take action to prepare for what is unseen. You take your vitamins, you eat well, you try to stay healthy. You prepare a room, you gather supplies. There might be some fear for what is to come, but that fear doesn't stop you from working while you wait.

I recently started following Morgan Harper Nichols on Instagram. She is a Christian musician, songwriter, artist, and writer. In 2017, she started writing letters for strangers as part of a goal to write a million poems to strangers in her lifetime. People can submit stories on her website, and she writes a letter of encouragement. These are also posted anonymously on social media.

Recently, she wrote, "Hope is knowing that you don't have to have everything figured out for the future before you take action. You don't have to be fearless before you sow seeds of faithfulness."

Romans 8:22-25 tells us that the whole of creation is groaning together with the pains of childbirth, anxiously waiting for our redemption. "For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience."

Taken together, the quote by Morgan Harper Nichols and our scripture reading for today remind me of my pregnancies and not for the obvious allusion to the pains of childbirth. The waiting, the hoping.

My point is this: we are presently witnessing the groanings of our world. We see pain and heartache and struggle, and we look to the skies for our redemption. Some of us are fearful and anxious. We pray. We hope. We wait. "But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." In your hope and in your patience, take action. Do not wait for your fear to subside. Let your hope lead you to do the work to alleviate the pain, the heartache, and the struggle of your neighbors. We don't have to have everything figured out - sow his seeds while you wait.
