In the midst of a global pandemic where we are being told to remain 6 feet apart and avoid in-person gatherings, writing a Harbinger cover on this year's stewardship theme of "Together" seemed a bit ironic...

It goes without saying, but this has been a HARD year. In mid-March, our 4-year-old and 6-month-old came home from daycare for their Spring break week and did not return for 4 months. My husband and I saw colleagues around us lose their jobs, and experienced overwhelming stress, anxiety and survivor's guilt as more work was piled on our plates while also trying to care for 2 children at home. Our daughter did not get to have a 5th birthday party or get to experience her first summer on the swim team. My 99-year-old grandmother in New York passed away after 2 months with no visitors in a nursing home, and we watched her funeral via video feed.

People have had to cancel trips, weddings, graduation parties. Many are grieving formative milestones that were not at all what they expected. Children who relied on school as a stable safe haven are instead at home, falling through the cracks of society's safety net that seems to have unraveled in 2020. My heart is broken daily with news reports of worsening economic conditions, hospitalizations and deaths, racial injustice, explosions, fires, and natural disasters. As election season draws near, political ads will undoubtedly be targeted toward amplifying our fear, and in a year like this it doesn't take much to bring that fear to the surface.

To combat the fear and worry, I have tried to find the silver linings. We have bonded with our neighbors because everyone was always home. We have gotten much more time with our children and witnessed precious milestones firsthand. When we were able to get together with grandparents and family, our appreciation for their presence and help with our kids was multiplied tenfold. We still have jobs. We are healthy. We are truly among

Which brings me to the topic of "Together." If I had to boil down the lessons of this year to the single kernel of truth I have learned, it is that we cannot thrive in isolation; we are in this together and community is critical to our well-being. While we cannot physically gather together in the literal sense we are accustomed to, we must come together in other ways. We must use our voices to vote and remove barriers so that everyone who is entitled to vote has that opportunity. We must be the hands and feet of God, finding new ways to show love and grace to our neighbors during this unprecedented time. And we must give generously from our abundant blessings by pledging during this year's stewardship campaign because now, more than ever, our community needs us. We can sow hope instead of fear and rise to that
