#### From the Pews, Kelly Heegard:

I'm not a fan of social distancing. It's not that I don't understand the need for it or the rationale behind it because I certainly do. I just think that when the term was coined and made its way into our daily lexicon, it missed the mark. Physical distancing? Sure. Properly spaced? Okay. But socially distant? No. The pandemic has immeasurably altered our daily lives and social distancing has left many people feeling isolated and disengaged. That's why it is so important for our church community to not be socially distant, but connected. For us to have the comfort from knowing that while we are physically apart, we are together in spirit.

Being together has been a tough task recently. It wasn't long ago, that our family's Sundays consisted of perpetually trying, with varying degrees of success, to get our kids dropped off in the childcare and make it into the sanctuary before the services started. My wife and I would scurry in last minute with a knowing glance to the other parents of preschoolers sitting in the last few rows. Despite the chaos of it all, we miss it. We miss the music and fellowship. Our kids miss seeing friends and going to Children's Church. And, of course, we all miss the donuts. And while we're hopeful that we'll have our chaotic Sundays back again, donuts and all, we take comfort in knowing that we remain connected to each other through our faith and as the Apostle Paul writes in Romans 8:38-39, through our love from God.

For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Whether you've been directly affected by COVID-19 or not, we have all sacrificed something. Many of us, myself included, have sacrificed visiting loved ones and traded it for seeing them through the screen of an iPad. The separation has been tough, but I'm comforted by Paul's message. It reminds us that while we are physically apart from one another, we are not separated from God's love. It calls us to not be socially distant, but to be connected. To be together. Just six feet apart.
