In this time of critical need, we are excited to expand our “Drive Season” initiative to offer monthly food and goods drives to benefit our mission partners across the city. The Serenity Place drive was a tremendous success. Young mothers and their children are already benefitting from the benevolences you offered.

They are also in need of items for individual hygiene: hotel-sized soap, shampoo, and lotion, small bottles of hand sanitizer, q-tips, standard sized spray deodorant, standard-size vaseline, hydrogen peroxide, and shaving cream, wash cloths, sunscreen, chapstick, and bug spray.

Intro to Humbleness 101

Philippians 2:3-4 *“Don’t be selfish; don’t try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don’t look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too.”*

As paraphrased by Spock: “The needs of the many outweigh the needs of the one.”

Today’s scripture is the perfect teaching package. Paul’s text in Philippians 2:3-8 provides instruction followed by example. In six brief verses it summarizes the entire interaction of God with us earthlings and instructs us on the manner in which we earthlings should interact with our fellow earthlings. The king saw a need, set aside the crown, joined the throng, and created ever-expanding waves with his gentleness, kindness, and openness. Firm when needed, but always leading with compassion.
