Mark 2: 13-17 Jesus calls Levi

How can I, a sinner, follow Jesus' will in my life?

I have the example of his life on earth. I have the examples of those he called while he was living among us. I have the examples of those that have faithfully followed since his resurrection.

I think he respects the courage it takes to follow him. He puts himself and his disciples squarely in the middle of the fray of our humanity. Through every hardship, he leads us forward. That is his promise.

This biblical text tells us Jesus called Levi, a despised tax collector, as he walked by his tax booth. Then our Lord went to Levi's home and ate with him, and those who many considered, his disreputable friends. Jesus knew Levi inside and out. He knew this tax collector would follow. He knew Levi would measure up. Jesus was with him every step of the way. Pharisees were watching. Jesus taught, by action and by word. He came for the sinners, not for the righteous.

The Bible shows us those he called did not fully understand his mission. At times, they faltered and told him they really were not up to the tasks he set before them. They did not always want him to go through with his holy objective. They even, at times, denied their unique relationship with him to others.

They remained human, yet so loved by Jesus, and saved by his grace, that he transformed them and moved them forward with him.

From our very creation, we, his people, have sinned. Still, he calls us. Still, he remains with us. He turns our expectations of our God and our world upside down. The first shall be last. The marginalized, the despised, can be exalted. Levi, the tax collector became Matthew, the disciple.

He calls his people over and over again. We, today, must continue to confess our sins. We must acknowledge our mistakes. We must work to change the social injustices we have created. We must right the wrongs we know to be of our own making. Christ is with us. We have been called.

It will never be easy. We might have to give up the world's idea of power. We might get hurt. We may not live to see all of the fruits of Jesus' love in action. Contemporary disciples, Martin Luther King Jr. and John Lewis did not. So many others throughout the ages did not. But their willingness to follow Jesus has changed our world for the better. We must begin where Jesus and the disciples before us have brought us. Jesus is with us too, and he is in charge. We must continue the journey he sets before us. I pray for his courage and his will for us all. And I thank God every day for the disciples in our midst, right here, right now.
