God works in mysterious ways." How many times have we heard that cliché little statement (or any of the potentially more damaging others like "God won't give you more than you can handle" or "Everything happens for a reason")? Throughout history, we as humans have often tried to figure out ways that we can attribute our trials and tribulations back to God. Let's be honest: many of us still do this. I can't tell you how many times this year I have heard people say something to the effect of "this pandemic is happening because of our sins, such as (insert favorite sin here)." It fits our sense of legalism and fairness that in order for something bad to happen, we (or "they") must have done something to deserve it; in other words, karma comes around to bite you on the hind parts.

I don't know how many of you know someone who has become seriously ill or died from COVID itself. I personally know 5 people who have died and several more who continue to suffer with complications from the disease. Our country passed a grim milestone last week. We have now lost over half of a million people to COVID. If you count the people who died because their care suffered secondarily (i.e. my husband's grandmother that died because there was not enough staff at her nursing home to replicate the care she got pre-COVID-lockdown when my mother-in-law and other family and friends could ensure that she ate at least one full good meal every day and could more tightly monitor her mental and physical status every day), that number soars to even greater heights. The people who have died did not "deserve it." Those who continue to suffer with complications have not sinned any more than the rest of us. We cannot mentally comprehend loss this large. We have difficulty understanding how God can fit into this story of suffering on such a monumental scale, which is why we so often reach for explanations that appeal to any standard of fairness. Where is God when the suffering is so immense?

The answer is that God is always with us. God gives out grace and peace and love abundantly. God's hands are our hands. We are called to bring God's grace, peace, and love into the world and thereby bring this world into the fullness of creation. This year, we have done that by wearing our masks, staying home when we are sick, and reaching out to friends and family in new ways when physical distancing kept us apart. For some, being God's hands has meant actually physically caring for people when they are sick. For others, being God's hands has meant buying groceries for friends, family, and neighbors when you are at the store. We each have our own place in the body of God's creation. God does indeed work in mysterious ways in that he works through us. Let us go out into the world today as the hands and feet of God. Let us ask ourselves every day how we can bring God's light into the world. How can we love one another as God loves us?
