On that afternoon I listened in shock as the principal of my child's elementary school announced that schools would be closed for the next two weeks. Deep breaths. It's only two weeks I told myself with my head between my knees. "We can do this," my friends at the shower reassured each other looking around the room for tribal strength. Only two weeks. It would be fun. Lots of time together. It was a beautiful spring. Before we know it, we'll be back to school and back to life as we know it.

Oh... how wrong we were.

I spent much of that spring praying. Praying to stand up to the mental and emotional load I was bearing. Praying for patience with my children. Praying for the words to help my children understand the confusion that was roiling our world. Praying for guidance as I navigated the ever changing landscape of what was considered safe. Praying for our leaders to keep their heads in order to keep us protected during this unknown time. Praying for my family and friends and those all around the world.

When I reflect on what I expect will be an indelible portion of our lives, I think I prayed more during that beautiful spring than I have in my life. But as a result of the tension between that struggle and the comfort of prayer, I felt closer to God.

In Psalm 18 the writer begins by stating "I love you, O Lord, my strength." I now realize that's really all we need to know.
