When I first got the scripture for this Harbinger cover, I thought, "Ok, I'll write about modern day miracles." Which I do think is part of this story, but I think there is more to this story than meets the eye, initially.

A couple of days before this Harbinger was due, I treated a patient who loves and serves the Lord so very well. I told her I needed to write a devotional on the text of Jesus, through the disciples, performing a miracle, and it led to a beautiful, Godly discussion about this text.

The first point is that God used the disciples to facilitate this miracle of healing. God performed the miracle, but through the disciples. Thus, God can perform miracles through you and I. God could've performed this miracle without the disciples, but this story shows us that we are ambassadors for Christ and because of our sharing of God's love, have the ability to bring others to him.

Secondly, I think it is really interesting that this beggar clearly had physical needs, but I think the disciples saw his spiritual needs more. They saw past his physical appearance, to the needs of his heart. In healing him physically, the man was healed spiritually. Also, because of his miraculous healing, he was a visible sign to others of just what Christ can do in our lives.

Lastly, I think the timing of this story is important to take into account. We don't know exactly how long the beggar sat outside and begged for money and goods, but I get the impression it's been years, as the others in the city knew and recognized this man once he was healed. That being said, this miracle could've been performed long ago, but it was performed at the perfect time — God's time. Maybe the man wouldn't have been ready to accept Jesus into his life if it weren't at this precise time.

I think back to the beautiful, Christ-filled conversation this story led to with my patient and even though I may not have been performing a miracle in the name of Jesus, I think it's neat that I was helping this patient physically, considering the text. I think we are all called to be "liaisons" for Christ, much like the disciples in this story.
