From the Pews, Brandon Coker

Blinded ... The scripture passage for this week has so many different potential discussion topics; from God's message from heaven to Saul, a man that was persecuting followers of Christ, to blinding Saul for three days, to the direction to Ananias to go and heal Saul so that he may carry on the words of God to others. As I was studying the passage, I became mostly curious as to what was going through Saul's mind for the three days of being blind and not eating or drinking. Was he wondering what just happened? Was he "coming to grips" with the realization of the truth of Christ, and his fate? Did the three days provide him with the time to assess and plan for how he should change his life, and the focus of his thoughts and actions? Was he blinded so he could be present with his thoughts, and think through what happens now?

My thoughts then gravitated quickly to wondering if I am blinded by all of the daily activities of life. Do I do have a focused and consistent relationship with God? While I would obviously not want to be physically blind for any amount of time, let alone three days like Saul, my relationship with God could definitely use more time in quiet, focused and consistent prayer.

What do you do when you have a spare moment, hour, day without many to-dos or distractions? Laura and I both are to-do list, calendars and goals "people." With three kids and two careers, we really have to be, and I know we are not alone in doing this. My kids always sigh when I make us go over yearly goals on the way home from Columbia after our family Christmas get together. Our goals are typically full of items focused on grades, financial management, reading books, travel, health, etc. I write down these goals and then periodically discuss and assess. We make time to plan and pursue these goals. Saul used his three days of "blinded focus" to plan for a change in his life and in his relationship with God. Our yearly goals need to include making time every day for prayer, our "blinded focus," to build and maintain our relationship with God.
