This week's scripture passage is John 17:6-19. As you read the verses, you can hear Jesus' concern for us after his death. Jesus fears Christians will be lost, yet we hear a voice of encouragement asking us each to continue his teachings. Jesus has done all he can on earth and is preparing to leave, but why is he worried about leaving us? As a teacher, Jesus is uncertain if his work is complete and if he has fully prepared us. Will we become lost in grief after his death or be able to rise and walk in his footsteps? Are his footsteps deep enough for us to follow? If so, how long will they last? Jesus has been called home and knows this is his next chapter; he does not simply ask God for more time on Earth, but instead reaches out pleading for our support after his death.

Aren't our lives filled with beginnings, changes, and endings? Often, we eagerly await the exciting new adventures ahead. It could be a new school, learning to drive, the birth of a child, marriage, or a new job. Our minds become filled with dreams and hopes of the opportunities ahead. We are excited to learn and immerse ourselves in everything about these experiences. We have many changes throughout our lives, some more welcome than others. Sometimes, though, change is more unwanted or unforeseen, and it can clog our thoughts with angst and concern. Change can also come so unexpectedly. I'm reminded of difficult, recent national news; I have a sinking feeling each time I hear of another mass shooting in our world. Can you imagine the grief of those first learning the heartbreaking news of an unexpected and unforeseen loss of an innocent loved one?

The death of Jesus is certainly one of those unwanted endings, and Jesus seems to know that his followers will grieve his death. Jesus has brought the word of God to the people and they have accepted the word. Now, Jesus prays to God and wants to ensure God is going to protect us after his own death.

For me, this passage will be helpful the next time life throws an unwanted change. It serves as a reminder that God walks with each of us throughout our lives. Even more, this passage reminds us that everything we encounter in life comes from our faith and the promise of life eternal though the sacrifice Jesus made for us so that we can live with grace each day of our life on earth. With this passage in our hearts, may we always embrace change and know that God will walk with us through each of life's challenges. Amen.
