## From the Pews, Sarah Brice

Our daughter, Anna, often counsels me, "Less is more." Although she is usually referring to jewelry or home décor, it occurs to me that the value of simplicity is applicable to many other aspects of life. Isn't it a marvelous mystery how we eventually learn so much wisdom from our offspring?

Perhaps this value of simplicity can be applied to our scripture for today, Mark 3:19b-27, to help us understand its meaning. When I first read the passage, a single word popped into my head: "inscrutable." After uttering one of my favorite one word prayers that Anne Lamott suggests: "Help," almost immediately the name "Leigh" occurred to me. Again, a single word. It is not surprising, given her vast knowledge of the Gospel of Mark, that Leigh very helpfully recommended a useful commentary, *Interpretation Bible Studies: Mark*. I'm sure you can just imagine my feelings of smug self-satisfaction when I read the author's learned opinion that this is "one of the most arduous passages in the Bible." So it is not just me who finds these words nearly impossible to fathom! However, I will try to state (fairly) simply the truth that I have gleaned from this passage. In verse 22, the scribes question Jesus' remarkable goodness embodied in his deeds. Mark seems to answer this question by saying that Jesus represents God—who is goodness personified—reigning on earth. Jesus, then, is the antithesis of Satan, or evil. Though we humans may not understand or comprehend the inscrutable magnitude of God's goodness or love for us, if we choose to follow Jesus, our lives—and the world through us—are forever changed: a simple truth but with huge significance. As Anne Lamott might pray, "Wow."

As a final comment on the value of simplicity, an important lesson the pandemic has taught many of us is that there is tremendous substance in the seemingly mundane things and particularly in the wonders of nature. We find so much joy in the repetitive pleasure of daily neighborhood walks, the sweet song of birds, the splendid sights and scents of spring flowers, the gentle sound of gurgling water in a nearby stream, the solemn tolling of the time from our Westminster bell tower, the pleasant sharing of an outdoor meal with a loved one—quite simply, the comfort of our daily routine. To express appreciation for all of this, I would agree with Anne Lamott as she might simply whisper heavenward another of her one word prayers, "Thanks!"
