From the Pews, Bill Ballinger

Today's New Testament scripture, Mark 4: 30-32, is part of the "parable of the sower." For context, Jesus is teaching by a lake, but due to the size of the gathering crowd, moved out into the lake on a boat.

"³⁰ He also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? ³¹ It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; ³² yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."

A parable is a simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson. Through Mark we learn how Jesus sometimes chose to speak to, and teach, his followers. Jesus used parables so that those who were listening could better understand his teachings. Earlier verses in Mark 4 reference the sower sowing seeds on different types of ground or soil, and the seeds ability to take true root and grow. Verses 30-32 speak directly of the seed itself. More specifically, the "mustard seed." In this parable, the sower is God. The mustard seed is God's word and gift of the opportunity to be in His kingdom. The earth, or soil, is us. Many things are 'planted' into our lives. We are the only beings given the free will, or choice, to decide which of these things are nurtured to take root and grow in our lives. Too many times God's intention and God's direction for us, to live and carry out our lives as He intended, is buried under other items. These things and goals become important to us in our lives, and our focus, and carry us farther and farther away from what is truly important.

The past year and a half has been particularly difficult. Sin, temptation, illness and tragedy is everywhere these days. Despite this, there remain 'God moments' throughout each and every day. Looking for and finding these moments to be thankful and grateful for, even the little things, helps keep us connected to God's plan and gifts.

An example of these moments for me was last spring, when I was unable to work due to the pandemic. While I could have focused on the negative, I was provided the truly wonderful gift of time with our (then) 17-month-old son. That type of time will very likely never come again, but I am forever thankful that God provided those special moments with my family.

God wishes to be central in our lives. Constantly being on the lookout for his presence, and his blessings, however small, allows our hearts, minds and souls to be well-prepared to receive riches far greater than anything our minds could possibly comprehend. Amen.
