I'm not a soccer fan really. Baseball was much more of a "fit" for me growing up. All of the running involved in soccer was not attractive, and I still don't really grasp the rules, so when my wife said I had to watch this "Ted Lasso" show about an English soccer team, my expectations were low. Fast-forward to last Friday night, I'm immediately downloading the 2nd season of "Ted Lasso," after watching the first season multiple times. I love the show because it's part sports, part comedy, part drama, part motivation, and pretty much all "feel good" story. If you haven't watched it, I'm obviously on the bandwagon of encouraging others to watch.

In probably the most dramatic scene of the first season, the main character, Ted, is made aware of some deceitful actions that were done to him. His response was to forgive the apologetic agitator. Ted's forgiveness was met with surprise, and then tears and hugs. He then says, "If you care about someone, and have a little love in your heart, there ain't nothing you can't get through together."

Our scripture reading for today is Jesus' response to Peter's question of how many times should we forgive those who "sin against" him, "up to seven times?" Jesus' response is to forgive many multiples of seven times, essentially to always forgive those who sin against you. This direction from Jesus is much easier to hear and recall, than to consistently follow throughout our day to day.

For the past several months, I've been struggling to forgive someone close to me. My response has been to either rehash why I'm right and the other person is wrong, ignore the issue, or only occasionally pray. Then I read this scripture and confirmed that my approach isn't working, and I need to follow Jesus' direction. I love and care about this person, but we need to forgive. It will not be easy, and will most certainly be uncomfortable, but as Ted says, "Taking on a challenge is a lot like riding a horse. If you're comfortable while you're doing it, you're probably doing it wrong."
