From the Pews, Alissa Edwards

This week's scripture is the parable of the prodigal son. This is the familiar parable of the young son who is estranged and then returns to his home with the older son feeling upset because the father welcomes the younger son back after he leaves. I think that the parable can be broken down into three main ideas.

The first idea is to look inside yourself. If you look at the parable from the perspective of the prodigal son, and ask for forgiveness and welcome God into your heart, you can see the worth that God sees in you. If you look at the parable from the older son, know that God has given all that you need, and more. We should be grateful for his gifts. Holding a grudge against the prodigal son accomplishes nothing more than putting a strain on your relationship with God.

The second idea is to know that God is waiting for you with open arms. I think that we can all relate to the prodigal son at some point in our lives due to mistakes we make, but we need to be grateful for the unconditional love and forgiveness that God has for us. As for the older son's perspective, no matter how close we are with God currently, we need to know that he loves us with agape love that's greater than we can even comprehend. When we fail, God is here to catch us. If you drift away, he will welcome you back. God's love for us is independent of any other relationship we have.

The third idea is that it's only about us and God. Whether we relate to the prodigal son or the other son, the parable is really about living your life between you and God and not worrying about keeping score with anyone else. The lesson is the same, wherever we are in our journey with Christ. It's about the personal relationship with God and recognizing that no matter our thoughts or actions, he loves us and welcomes us with open arms when we turn to him.

This parable is one about God's love for us. As we each have our own families, the church is also our family. God's love for us does not leave us if we drift. We need to know that God's love for us will always be there, no matter what stage of our life we are in or what we may face. God is love — unconditional love.
