# From the Pews, Zach Weaver

I bought an '85 Jeep CJ-7 early in the pandemic. I've wanted one since I was a kid. It's orange, it's a stickshift, and it's awesome. I like to joke that whoever said things won't make you happy just didn't have this Jeep. And it feels like the Reverend assigning bible passages for the Harbinger cover got word of the joke and felt like making a point this week.

To that end, our passage concerns the accumulation of things and the parable of the rich fool. Jesus tells a man to "[b]e on guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." The parable goes on to discuss a wealthy man who intended to build up barns to store a surplus of grain after a bumper crop year. He wanted to hold those crops for many years "[t]ake life easy; eat, drink and be merry." But God tells him that his life will be demanded that very night and his accumulated crops will not go to serve him. "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

It's easy to dislike this parable. It seems unfair. Someone works the land, earns a benefit, and wants to enjoy spoils. Is there something wrong with that? Those are most people's retirement goals.

But the broader takeaway for me is that the wealthy man in the parable has lost sight of what is important. He isn't thinking of others. His focus is solely on himself. That's not what God intended for us. We have the duty to give our time, money, and thought to God and those around us. If we focus on ourselves and what we can buy next, we're on a loop with no off-ramp; there's always something else to buy. Service to others should guide who we are rather than the accumulation of things.

So I'm not selling my Jeep, Reverend. But I will gladly offer free rides, and this week's passage is a good reminder that my thoughts and goals should be focused on others, rather than new tires or a renegade decal.
