From the Pews, Ellie DuBose

After more than a year of life in a pandemic, it can feel strange to begin old habits anew. For me, the news that the church would be reopening came not only with feelings of relief and joy, but also some guilt and hesitation. I will admit that I had not been the most consistent with watching the online worship services. Furthermore, I wanted to be sure that if I was going to be sitting in the congregation once again that I could do so without jeopardizing the safety of those around me. So despite my excitement to return to the sanctuary, I could not shake a sense of anxiety about the whole thing.

When I first stepped into the church after over a year away, all my worries quickly subsided. I was greeted by faces I hadn't seen for months, and I even found that my family's old pew was just the same as how we had last seen it. I left church that morning with a newfound sense of gratefulness and grace. My entire experience of returning to Westminster might well be described by today's scripture in the call to worship. In the passage, God welcomes us into his home after a time of great strife with open arms:

"On this mountain the Lord Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine— the best of meats and the finest of wines. On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; he will swallow up death forever."

This year's stewardship theme is "Home," and I can hardly imagine a better place to call mine. Though I know there will be more times in my life when I feel lonely or without hope, I can trust that I will always have this community to welcome me back home.
