# From the Pews, Walter Hinton

According to a well-worn saying from Robert Frost, "home" means the place where, when you have to go there, they have to take you in.

I believe the saying rings true in life experience. In our childhood home, if we are fortunate, we receive unconditional love and caring from our parents. Once grown, we settle in a separate dwelling place, perhaps with a significant other, and we set about to make that place a home of our own. There we endeavor to recreate the love we experienced as children. Whether childhood home or grownup home, the saying still applies; when we show up, our parents or our partners have to take us in.

The home you came from exerts a magnetic pull. Raised in a small town, my grandfather left there a century ago for opportunities in the big city far away, in time becoming a business leader. But after 10 years in retirement, he returned to his birthplace to live out his days. By then the town had visibly gone downhill, but to him it was still home.

Is Westminster succeeding as a church home? Does it continue to be a welcoming place? Carol and I believe so. On moving to Greenville, we sought a church where we could learn and grow in faith and understanding. We chose WPC and have stayed ever since. In adult Sunday school, Bible study, Theology Reading group, November Nights, worship, Heritage lectures, Movie group, Hiking group, IHN, ChristCare, pastor's breakfasts and other church activities, all members and visitors as well are welcome. All points of view receive a fair hearing; listenership is practiced. Others would appear to agree, as the congregation continues to grow. Rejection is not among our practices.

The life of any church requires a space adequate to the population. WPC's original worship space was modest, a tent pitched in an empty roadside lot. Since then the physical plant has progressed in stages. In more recent years, with the congregation growing steadily, it became clear that the increasing worship attendance could soon overcrowd the sanctuary. In response, the church launched a capital campaign to enlarge the space. The daunting task charged to designers was to leave the space looking esthetically just the same as before, only a good deal larger. In a labor of love, the designers succeeded. I have always thought that campaign, "A Place for Everyone," was aptly named for our church. If you show up, you see, they take you in.
