# From the Pews, Jennifer McDavid

I didn't grow up at Westminster. My parents and sister joined after I had gone off to college, but when I moved back to Greenville almost 12 years later, this beautiful church was where I felt most at home. At first, it was the familiar faces: our neighbors and friends. Then, I started going to Sunday School and meeting new people there. When I joined my mom and sister on one of the mission trips to the Dominican Republic, I met and formed bonds with so many other people in the congregation of all ages. It was only one week spent doing some incredibly hard, incredibly dirty, and incredibly valuable work alongside some incredibly awesome people, but that week cemented this church and its people into my life.

My husband and I were married here. We helped build a Habitat house. My children have been baptized here. I see friends from church all over town, even when they bring their pets to see me at work. I see people from this congregation in the news, doing good things in Greenville and beyond. I see other members quietly doing work that is vitally important, yet not as visible. Just seeing the blue Westminster magnet and/or sticker on fellow members' cars gives me an immediate rush of community.

The past (almost) two years have been so difficult in so many ways. Our family has struggled to stay engaged with life outside of our physical home. Fear of this virus, spreading it to our loved ones or causing harm to others, has had a near total grip on our lives. I have lost clients to it and seen friends debilitated with longterm health problems. It has been hard to creep back toward "normal," especially when it feels like there could be another surge around the corner.

Throughout this time, Westminster has been a beacon of calm, peace, and care for others. We kept moving steadily forward, under the guidance of our ministers, Session, and COVID response team. When in-person worship resumed, we all rejoiced. We have had to step back to mostly virtual again within our own family for the past couple of months, but how grateful we are that we have worship options.

Our church does so much good in our world. Each person in this congregation brings gifts to our collective table. By joining this community of faith, we each take on a responsibility to bring God's goodness into the world around us, into creating a home for God's creation. Home is more than a building or a location on a map. Home is a feeling of being where you are welcomed and valued and loved. Westminster is that place and community for our family.
