From the Pews, Elizabeth Timmons

I have a confession: For every Harbinger cover I have written, I have anxiously awaited the email reminder from Michelle with the sermon scripture for the upcoming week. Admittedly, while waiting each time I've thought, "I can't wait to write something so profound" and then I receive the text and am honestly... stumped... for a little while. I read the text over and over to find a deeper meaning. I do a Google search for a few different interpretations and usually end up thinking, "Why did they ask me to write Harbinger covers?" I am in my late twenties with just under 5 years of work experience. I live a simple life between work and caring for my dog. I am far from being a writer, being much more math/science minded. Why me? Then it hit me. This is what the text is all about. God uses ordinary people, the "why me?" people, to deliver his good news.

In the story, it seems like Elizabeth struggled with this "why me?" concept at first, too. Verse 43 quotes her saying "But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" And verse 45 nails it saying, "blessed is she who has believed that the Lord will accomplish what he said to her". Bingo. There it is. Elizabeth believed in God and this story is the beginning of her starting to spread the news of Jesus.

I'm not sure why I ask myself "why me?" so often when thinking about God's calling in my life. When asked to write Harbinger covers or be a youth group leader, I promise you at some point I asked myself, "why me?" Why did God give Elizabeth and Zechariah a child at such old ages? Why did he send his son to be born to an unmarried virgin woman? Why Elizabeth? Why Mary? Why me? Why you? Because He would change the world through ordinary people just like you and me.

I am reminded of the contemporary Christian song, "Control," by Tenth Avenue North. The refrain starts with "God you don't need me but somehow you want me". He wants the ordinary people like you and me to spread His good news.
