This week's scripture comes from the book of Isaiah. Isaiah has been called the "fifth gospel" by many in the way that it preaches the Advent and Christmas gospel. While many chapters in this book detail the terror of sin and injustice, this chapter emerges as a light. The prophet Isaiah offers resolute hope in the coming of the messiah and his peaceable kingdom. Just the opening of the chapter alone offers a visual of hope and new life. "A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse, from his roots a branch will bear fruit." Life emerging from death, such a lasting and iconic message to start out our passage.

The next few verses of chapter 11 begin to discuss what type of person this promised messiah will be. The messiah will be someone who is wise and understanding, powerful, and advocates for the poor. All of the promises made to Israel will be fulfilled in a human being that embodies Israel's values and traditions. Not only will the messiah be a mere human embodying these many values, but the harmony that will ensue is unprecedented. The meek will be advocated for, the wicked persecuted, and enemies will live in harmony. What a remarkable reign to live in.

The past year has taught us that the world is compromised. Take courage and invite God's promise to take hold into your life in the present. Cling to a new vision of creation where we care for one another and love each other. The kingdom told to us by Isaiah can be ours - present and future. The messiah is coming. The messiah is here, friends - hallelujah!
