From the Pews, George McLarty

My mind started to wander as I read this week's scripture, Matthew 2:1-12. Immediately, thoughts of the celebrated visit to see the newborn Child in Bethlehem and the gifts presented by the wisemen bounced around in my head. These verses had me thinking of the bright searchlight shining on Wade Hampton Blvd. each December, the Christmas pageants I have attended in the past, the carols I have sung countless times, the nativity scene our family sets up each year, and the Westminster Christmas service with all of those adorable kids. Once all these initial thoughts settled, I then began to wonder more about the star directing the wisemen on their journey to see Jesus: what guides are we following in our lives?

We are all familiar with the story of the wisemen's visit, but how do we connect their journey to our own lives? As I reflect on the guides in my travels, my first thoughts are of all those state maps poorly folded and stuffed in my glovebox years ago. Maybe even having to pull the car over to figure out exactly which way to turn on an unfamiliar path. Today, our phones guide us on the fastest route to a new destination, but these are not what is truly guiding us through life. What will enable us to open our hearts and minds to new directions? What will allow us to see the light and know this is the right direction for us? We should all strive to have God's light to be our guide and moral compass as we navigate life.

Most parents have informed a child when they are in need of an attitude adjustment. This is likely because they observe the child acting selfishly or refusing to share with others. Is it not the case that anyone fixed in their own way of thinking is also due for an attitude adjustment? If we are on a self-centered course with no desire for change, how are we going to be able to see God's light guiding us in new directions? A complacent attitude may inhibit us from being open to new lights or having the self-awareness essential for change to occur. We also should acknowledge that some of our actions need improvement; they may be self-centered or even harmful to others. We must actively seek God's direction before we can begin to see the light. When we allow ourselves to see God's light, hopefully we can change our direction as we aim to become better followers of Christ.
