James and I happen to love visiting the Big Apple. Could it be that part of our fascination lies in the contrast between the sheer size of New York City and our two tiny hometowns, McCormick and Due West, respectively? Whatever the reason, we travel to NYC for at least four weeks out of most years, savoring the vast variety the city has to offer. While there, we visit museums for culture, walk miles and miles for exercise and eat at many fine restaurants, always searching for the perfect carrot cake.

In 2018, we attended a memorable performance at the 92nd Street Y-a reenactment of singer Bobby Darin's fascinating brief life. Named at birth Walden Robert Cassotto, he happened to observe a Chinese restaurant sign with the first three letters burned out (MAN) and adopted the surname "Darin" because of it. A transformed persona was born.

Our scripture passage for today, Luke 5: 27-32 tells of another name change: Levi, the hated tax collector, later becomes known as Matthew. This is the same beloved Matthew who wrote the first Gospel, the first book in the New Testament, which traces the life of Jesus, from his miraculous birth to his despairing death to his triumphal resurrection. Just how did Levi's transformation take place? It seems that his early interaction with Jesus served as the pivotal and profound event in his life. According to verse 27, Jesus simply said to him, "Follow me." Then Levi left everything, and rose and followed him, embodying Dietrich Bonhoeffer's statement that "there is no road to faith or discipleship... only obedience to the call of Jesus." That is exactly what Levi/Matthew did-he adopted a complete lifestyle change, giving up the great riches of being a tax collector to become one of the disciples. One wonders whether Levi might have been a part of the large crowds following Jesus, thereby seeing the miracles Jesus performed and hearing the message he taught about the love of God, forgiveness, and eternal life, thus choosing to embrace the life of a disciple.

In calling Levi, a tax collector, to follow him, Jesus went against cultural stigmas of his day, not caring that Levi was viewed as a wretched sinner and, as a tax collector, despised by most Jews. As we see in verse 30, the Pharisees and their scribes "murmured against" both Jesus and his disciples. They could not believe that a purportedly holy man, a Rabbi (teacher), would associate with such a vile sinner. Thankfully for all of us, Jesus states that he did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance. This radical shift from what was expected defines the nature of Christianity—and compels us followers to do the unexpected. We are to love and embrace those who might be considered outside the boundaries of God's love, doing as Jesus did. Just like Bobby Darin's 1967 album title, Jesus turned things "Inside Out" --what an example to follow!
