From the Pews, Brandon Coker

My kids are so embarrassed by my car. I drive a 2007 Honda Pilot. It does not have the big touchscreens, the apps, or the huge sunroof. This is karma for me complaining about my dad's 1968 Camaro when I was a kid, and ironic as I would love to have that car now. I do enjoy driving Laura's car though, as it is a lot newer, more comfortable, and has some cool features. One of my favorite features on her car are the sensors for when I'm veering out of my lane into traffic, not braking quick enough when someone is in front of me, or about to run into another car when parking or backing up. These sensors have lights and loud beeping noises to let me know I'm at risk and try to keep me and others safe.

Our scripture reading for today from Psalm 32 discusses sin and transgressions along with confession and forgiveness. The passages describe "wasting away" and "drying up" when staying silent and being forgiven by God and provided a "hiding place" when acknowledging and confessing transgressions. I read the passage as one of thankfulness for the grace, blessings and forgiveness we receive from God.

We build a relationship with God through our prayers and confessions. My prayers almost always are a combination of thankfulness and asks for forgiveness. I'm so thankful for God's many blessings, and also admittedly disheartened with my failures to be consistently patient, loving, kind, and selfless. I believe when we pray, we build a strong relationship with God, and that the prayer helps to turn on our conscience sensors. These conscience sensors try to move us away from risks and to a safer place closer to God.

Sometimes our conscience sensors are off or weak. Throughout our lives we probably have had periods of time where we are distant from our relationship with God. Whether it was a period of immaturity, a death, illness, family or personal struggle, I have had times when I've started to veer off track. Every time God has placed another "sensor" in front of me, often in the form of another person, a book, quote, or memory, that has turned my conscience sensors back on and has pulled me back on course. Those sensors are my favorite.
