From the Pews, George McLarty

Many years ago, I was asked to help with the youth group. I still remember the doubt swirling around in my head; wondering if I had the gifts required to be a good advisor or the biblical knowledge to guide our youth. I had no clue that I would be needing some very different skills to keep pace with those high energy kids. I discovered hidden gifts like thriving on no sleep during retreats, gorging on junk food, memorizing energizers, navigating traffic with a van full of teenagers, laughing at the silliest things, playing card games until the wee hours, and even just simply encouraging others to participate in activities.

Our scripture this week comes from Paul's first letter to the Christian community in Corinth. This passage begins by asking us to consider all the different types of gifts we received or possess. These gifts are a direct expression of God's spirit at work within each of us and within our Christian community. We are each given unique gifts, with the hope of using our gifts to support those around us.

At Westminster, we are fortunate to have a community filled with a variety of talented people who openly share their gifts for the benefit of others. We are blessed with fantastic artists, scholars, soloists, teachers, speakers, advisors, coaches, musicians, mentors, missionaries, and many more. Our scripture this week also reminds us of how these gifts may reach us in different ways. That is one of the reasons we have many ways to engage within the WPC community. from youth basketball to suppers with seven.

This passage also reminds us to appreciate the talents of others, but not be envious of others' gifts. We should consider ourselves fortunate to be touched by others' talents, but we should not think we received less from God. Everyone has talents that are known or hidden, and we should feel called to generously share those with others.

Becoming a youth advisor was a big commitment and could be really exhausting at times. But the youth are so amazing and can turn almost anything into fun. My initial doubts were quickly replaced by gifts of others and this role became rewarding. Many of those same youth are now leaders in the WPC community and continue to share God's word through their unique gifts. Seeing their talents lift our church inspires and encourages me, as I see God work in each of their lives.
