From the Pews, Bill Ballinger

I would imagine my faith journey to this point in my life is very similar to many others. I was born into and grew up in a family of believers. I went to Church, to Sunday School, to Vacation Bible School, to Youth Group and Youth Choir (Mark Kemp was actually an intern in the Music Ministry at First Baptist Greenville, my church growing up!), and mission trips. I was baptized. I believed in God and in Jesus. After high school, though, my attendance at church waned, and did for a few years until my wife and I established a church home at Westminster. Again, I believed in God, and in Jesus, but looking back, I certainly did not have what would constitute a true relationship with God and Jesus.

I've been fortunate to have many influences in my faith journey: family, friends, colleagues. I was introduced to a wonderful book by a colleague and very dear friend of mine, not a fan., by Kyle Idelman. The theme of the book is becoming a completely committed follower of Jesus. I highly recommend it. Early on in the book, I was struck by its reference to Matthew 7:22-23, that there are many who consider themselves to be Christians and followers of Jesus, only to ultimately stand in front of God in judgment and hear Him say, "I never knew you: go away from me." I cannot imagine what that would feel like. I do not want to know what that would feel like. One of God's goals is for us to be totally dependent on him. He wants to have a personal relationship with us. One of the lessons and practices I have learned that has furthered my faith journey is gratitude, and being thankful. That is what the scripture reading for today, Psalm 126, is about: gratitude and thankfulness. At first this sounds like an easy task, but it might not be as easy as you believe.

In a recent email from Ben, he referenced that "joys and sorrows are a part of everyday life." We all know this to be true. The Gospel of John writes, "In the world you face persecution. But take courage; I have conquered the world." In times of joy, it is easy to be thankful. It can be much more difficult to be thankful in times of sorrow, or trials. This is one area where faith can grow the most. No matter the circumstance, I try daily to be thankful. I constantly try to respond with praise, with joy, and with gratitude toward God for everything I can; for big things and little things. I talk to God daily. When times are tough, I try to take the position of, "I know you have a plan for this. I might not know what that is, but You do, and I trust You." I remind myself that God is in control; not my circumstances, and not my troubles. I try to fix my focus on God's faithful presence, and not on my circumstances. I might not be happy with the things that are troubling me, but I can thankful that it is part of God's plan for me, and he is still near to me. When difficult experiences become sources of praise, a closer relationship with God can take shape. When you can consistently praise and thank the Lord during times of trouble, it becomes easier to be thankful for all things. "Through toil and suffering rises great harvest of joy and thankfulness." Rather than placing strength in fear, worry, depression, doubt or anger, place strength in God's love for you. Paul the Apostle wrote, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." We are not promised freedom from struggle, but we are promised that God will always be present. With trouble, and when faith is tested, comes opportunities to grow in faith. I truly believe I have grown in mine.
