Sometimes, things go horribly wrong in people's lives, or they have a particularly bad day, and it is unfair to force a positive angle. Sometimes, people just need a minute to sit and rest. Being in pain- be it emotional, physical, or a combination- is exhausting, and being told to "see the bright side" in those situations is often the opposite of helpful.

While this way of thinking is usually refreshing, it can also be frustrating; are we not allowed to be in pain sometimes? To need to vent without being bombarded with silver linings and "at least"s?
