From the Pews, Mary Martha Smoak

I am a very new member of Westminster Presbyterian Church. Someone thought it would be a good idea to put me on a list to write for the Harbinger front page *From the Pews* section. I am not sure I qualify but I will make an attempt.

Having been Presbyterian from birth, I have noticed that Presbyterians overall like order. The liturgical calendar provides that order and my understanding is that ministers generally follow the scripture outlined for each Sunday and the seasons of the Church.

Acts 17:16-34 is the New Testament scripture for today. Since I am not a Bible scholar I turned to the NIV Study Bible and Google for help....it is a new age of research for me.

Paul traveled a lot and in this scripture he was addressing the city of Athens. The scripture addresses those ancient days and as usual could be sending a message to our doorsteps. Paul was distressed by the use of idols then and now. We, too, need to identify idols that may be in our lives. I do not believe folks actually worship idols in the form of statues; but, make no mistake we sometimes let the Spirit take a backseat in our lives. Jesus wants to be in the pilot seat as we navigate this life.

Paul comes to the people and is preaching strange ideas the people have not heard. He was offering the teachings of Jesus as a better way to worship God in the temple and in everyday life — carrying beliefs outside the wall of the synagogue. He intended for Christian beliefs to be put into action for everyone to hear and follow.

God is not to be held captive within the physical structure of a church building. Ben reminds us of this almost every Sunday.

As a visitor first and now a member of the church, I felt from the beginning that Westminster was populated by all ages of people who wanted to be kind to others and put the messages of Jesus into action. Our challenge is to be an active disciple seven days a week. Someone once told me when working toward a goal for change — we don't have to be an A student, but a good solid B will set us on our way.

Simply reviewing the opportunities listed in the Harbinger is a great way to identify the needs of church and community.
