

From the Pews, Rance Bryan

Johnston United Methodist Church averaged about 100 people per service in the years I attended. It was the classic, rural South Carolina church with one service at 11am and everyone knew everyone. My first memories of 'church' are in that building, and I attended every Sunday until I graduated high school and left for Clemson University.

Even though our church was small, God blessed us with a wonderful organist, Jim Landers, and music director, Jim Mohorn. The two of them took great pride in making sure our sanctuary was filled with beautiful music every Sunday. My father sang in the choir and I remember the cantatas they would perform during Christmas and Easter and how much work and practice they would put into the programs. We would often receive cassettes or CD's of the cantatas after the program and my mother still plays them quite often.

I specifically remember one Christmas Eve service where the clergy decided they would have Jim play the organ for a little over an hour. During this 'dropin' service, there would not be a sermon or any congregational singing, only Jim playing a variety of hymns. The congregation could arrive at any time during the program, sit in the sanctuary for as long as they liked, and then approach the altar for communion whenever they wanted. Ten-year-old me was way more excited about Santa Claus than going to church, so when I heard these plans, I was thrilled with that thought that we'd be out of there in less than 10 minutes. What struck me when we arrived was the number of parishioners who stayed for the entire service...just to sit quietly in our sanctuary and hear Jim play. I'll be honest. I don't remember any other Christmas Eve services from my childhood, but I do remember that one.

Psalm 30, verse 4 says 'Sing the praises of the Lord, you his faithful people; praise his holy name.' This verse made me think about the important role music plays in our worship service. Some of my earliest, and fondest, memories of church involve music. Today, I love hearing the organ play the Prelude as we prepare for the Call to Worship. It makes me feel at home, and the following hymns provide comfort and familiarity. And even though my singing is less than stellar (my kids would say terrible), I can find reassurance in Psalm 30, verse 12 "...that my heart may sing your praises and not be silent. Lord my God, I will praise you forever.'
