From the Pews, Kayla Burrell

As I read Ecclesiastes 3:1-14, I think to myself, "Yes, this makes sense. Of course there's a season for everything. Of course everything won't always stay the same." But then I think about going abroad this fall and leaving my elderly dog for four months, and I want nothing more than for time to freeze. And each day I'm gone, I'm sure I'll pray, "Please, not yet."

The passage also makes me remember how petrified I felt at the last WPC Youth Group event I attended. It was our last night at Montreat, and our leader announced to everyone still lingering in our building's common area that there were 10 minutes until lights out. I remember thinking out loud, "Ten minutes? That's not enough time." I did not feel ready for that season in my life to end.

However, no matter how unpleasant the end of each season may be for those of us who struggle with change (which is probably all of us to some degree), time keeps moving. One event after the next comes and goes. Some are joyful, and some are sad. Some are just painful at first because they are different from the
