Meagan and I joined Westminster in 2014. There were many common things that we were looking for in a church that were important to us since we were raised in the same small church in our hometown in Lowcountry South Carolina. We wanted a church that was welcoming to others, accepting to all, challenging to our faith, and a place we were comfortable for our future children to be raised. We moved away from our hometown and attended different churches near our respective universities, so we had no qualms with being open minded and attending different churches in the Greenville area.
