

From the Pews, Mark Matlock

PREPARING THE WAY

It was a little after Labor Day a few years ago when Kathy and I walked into the At Home store near Woodruff Road. Temperatures were in the 80s, Clemson had just started its football season and there wasn't a snowball in sight.

As we entered the store in shorts and flip flops, what appears before my wondering eyes but miniature sleighs and tiny reindeer ... and Santas of every shape and size ... and holiday lights and trees and decorations and elves and tinsel and on and on. I mean, c'mon people: Christmas in early September?

Sometimes we get too caught up in the secular side of Christmas. Our consumer-based society has spawned "mission creep." It used to be that Thanksgiving was the official kickoff of the season. Today that idea is almost quaint as the priming of the Christmas spending pump begins earlier and earlier.

It's up to us as Christians to keep our eyes on the prize embodied in our dear Savior's birth. But how? That partially can come through home rituals: reading devotionals, lighting Advent wreaths or opening Advent calendars. It also can be achieved by service and giving: volunteering at Meals on Wheels or United Ministries or the International Christmas Festival here at WPC.

Advent is about preparation much like the work of John the Baptist before Jesus began his ministry ("The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'" Matthew 3:1-12).

We prepare by keeping the faith, helping others and guiding our children to what matters most: the eternal grace and forgiveness of God through Jesus. Then we can filter out the drumbeat of consumerism and listen to the endearing message of love and hope revealed in a manger more than 2,000 years ago.

Prayer: *Heavenly Father, help us to listen quietly to your Word and prepare faithfully during this season of anticipation and hope. Let us be stewards of your world and proclaimers of your Word. Amen.*
