From the Pews, Mary Martha Smoak

The text today is Ecclesiastes 3:1-13. An aging Solomon is credited with the verses which "call out" to those who will listen to his wisdom. He is portrayed as a teacher, but is by no means perfect. He is looking back on his life from birth to eventual death.

King Solomon knows that human wisdom has limits and the people are chasing after hopes and expectations that are meaningless. He wants his audience to understand that God orders all things and that humankind should accept this ideology. All should be prudent and patient with the order of life God has designed.

The verses in this passage are known as lyrics by many song writers. These lyrics were written over 2,000 years ago and remain true today. Turn! Turn! Turn!, written and recorded by The Byrds in 1965, is an echo of the words of Ecclesiastes so many years later. It was used as a protest song of the Vietnam War as well as sung by activists during the civil rights movement: "To everything there is a season...And a time to every purpose under heaven." Words and sentiments that span the test of time and situations.

I believe King Solomon was saying, take a deep breath, do not toil away your days. Humans cannot fathom all God can do from the beginning of time to the end of time yet to come. We can't change the past and do not know the future. We can live only in the present. There is time for each season of life and we should have faith that good times will outweigh the bad. Take joy in the small things and be grateful for all the time in life we are granted. We all have the same 24 hours of the day. Slow down and be mindful. Take time to prioritize the goals of each day. Remember to set aside time for yourself to rest and recharge of the tasks at hand. God is with us and beside us all the days of our lives.
