with grace).

However, at some point (around the time I started driving), I realized that while driving was dangerous, the people driving the vehicles had more control over the passengers' safety than I had previously thought. When drivers and pilots are wise, alert, and cautious, their passengers are more likely to make it to their destination safely- as are the other people around them. So before we went on trips, and whenever I got nervous in the car or on a plane, I started praying for the drivers and pilots to stay alert and make good decisions. Even though I knew I could not control their actions, praying for them helped me stay calm.

In a time when international tensions seem high, I find 1 Timothy 2:1-2 especially relevant. It reads, "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity."

Whenever I am worried about the state of the world and there is nothing immediate I can do to resolve it, I find myself praying for people who do have that power to have wisdom and not to make rash decisions. Whenever I feel powerless, praying comforts me and gives me hope that God will find a way to let peace prevail.


